<u>Planes, Trains, and</u> Hurricanes


Joe knows where he is going in life. But one crazy road trip might just change everything.



Someone wants Patrick to find love this Christmas--no matter what it takes.



Once Upon a Christmas House




Unfortunately, it turned out to be a bit more complicated than that. If Davy didn't know better, he'd have thought this whole set—up was the universe trying to get him to learn something.
